1. CALL TO ORDER

Committee Chair Gloria Sanchez called the meeting to order at 10:01 AM.

2. ROLL CALL

Present were: Committee Chair Gloria Sanchez, Committee Vice-Chair Anne-Marie Novack, Committee Member Linda Blanche, Community Services Director Jonathan Nicks, Community Services Manager Mariana Mitchell, and Community Services Coordinator Aisha Wilson.

5. APPROVAL OF MINUTE

5.1. Minutes from August 1, 2022, Special Meeting

A motion to approve the August 1, 2022, minutes with corrections was made by Committee Vice-Chair Novack

Committee Member Blanche seconded motion.

Margaret Cordova suggested a splash pad be installed at least in one of the Menifee parks.

8. DISCUSSION ITEMS

8.1. Park Master Update

Recommended Action

- Review the presentation and comment or provide input for the Parks Master Plan Update.

Consultant Mike Singleton presented and provided information on the Parks Master Plan update.

Committee Chair Sanchez commented on lightning in Parks with amenities for safety. She highlighted that the senior population is fortunate to have senior workout station. She talked about parks that have limited parking. Especially when families go out together and hang out for hours.

Committee Member Blanche talked about at Central Park that the meditation area is a great place to bring calmness to people.

Member of the Public asked why there is no community pool in Menifee

Consultant Mike Singleton mentioned it has been brought about having one. He talked about how it would be a big undertaking for the city. Typically, a city without a pool would work with school districts to have a joint use agreement.

Committee Chair Sanchez responds to question two by stating family and sports parks. Having a park for all ages and making accessible for all.

Committee Member Blanche mentioned parking would also help

Committee Vice-Chair Novack suggested a community center like a theater with stage. A center that could have classes and arts. She would like to see enhancement to parks with shade feature or pond or water feature.

Consultant Mike Singleton stated that park shade structures are now state standard for parks.

Committee Vice-Chair Novack responded to question three by stating senior centers should also have programs that people learn skills

Committee Member Blanche suggested community theater.

Consultant Mike Singleton mentioned that there are also multigenerational centers where the facility has uses for all ages and tend to cross over.

Committee Chair Sanchez talked about having a class such as life learning for teens and seniors. Programs such as these would help.

Committee Member Blanche mentioned that Menifee is a great city and how it offers a lot of amenities. She also talked about how a lot of veterans are moving to Menifee.

Consultant Mike Singleton talked about how people go to parks for physical therapy to learn or relearn skills.

Committee Chair Sanchez responded to question four by stating that she would like Menifee to be able to accommodate different sports to hold tournaments at parks. She considered this a mid to long term goal. She also recommended to have a devoted park to accommodate large groups. Also, another Community Center. For short term goals, she suggested adding amenities to parks.

Committee Member Blanche suggested parks to have multiuse

Committee Chair Sanchez responded to question five by stating the city is doing a great job. From senior programs to youth programs and family programs.

Committee Vice-Chair Novack suggested offering senior programs on the other side of the 215 freeway.

Committee Chair Sanchez responded to question six and mentioned that there are many user groups for parks but not enough space. She mentioned we need more ball fields.

Committee Vice-Chair Novack talked about active and working seniors. Also, about transportation to the park. She suggested for events have it in different parks than just at one location.

Committee Chair Sanchez mentioned she would like to see the Friday Night Lights excursion program return for the seniors.

Committee Vice-Chair Novack responded to question seven by suggesting that all parks, programs, and services be under the same umbrella.

Committee Chair Sanchez agreed and stated that Valley Wide Parks District does not maintain parks. She talked about how they asked the Oasis community for funds for fencing the dog park

Committee Vice-Chair Novack mentioned that the building at Wheatfield would have a lot to offer but does not get used and has limited availability.

Committee Chair Sanchez mentioned that Marion Ashley does not offer senior programs and just youth. She hoped the City of Menifee continues to pursue acquiring the Valley Wide District Parks.

Community Services Manager Mariana Mitchell provided an update on Menifee transportation. She talked about how consultants identified Care-A-Van as service provider. Staff met with Care-A-Van and created an MOU for service in Menifee. MOU would go to city council for the September 21 meeting.

Committee Chair Sanchez asked about if this would be route stops for seniors.

Community Services Manager Mariana Mitchell responded that it would not be offered because there were concerns about route stops and lack of ridership.

Community Service Coordinator Aisha Wilson provide an update on senior programs and services of at the Kay Cenicerros Senior Center. She also provided an update of all upcoming City-Wide special events.

10. COMMITTEE MEMBER REPORTS ON COMMITTEE ACTIVITIES

Committee Member Blanche talked about how she attended the National Night Out event. She mentioned that the police department offered a lot of activities. She mentioned that in October Miller Jones would be offering an end-of-life panel discussion. Topics would include Wills & Trusts, Hospice, and arrangement preparations.

Committee Vice-Chair Novak talked about a event she attended in Riverside, which was on living trust and will. She mentioned it was very informative.

Committee Chair Sanchez mentioned talked about the survey at the board meeting and encourage for people to give feedback.
