Minutes of July 12, 2010

1. Call to Order

The meeting was opened at 6:32 by Mark Cooper, Chairman. Members present were Marty Rosen, David Johnson, LeAnn Coletta, Pete Peterson, Bill Beeman, Leah McGee, Thomas Giedroyce, Christine Schwartz, Phoebe Irey, Jason Roth, Gloria Sanchez, Nan Miller and City Representative, Rob Johnson.

Guests: Councilmember Darcy Kuenzi and Waste Management Representatives, Steve Glynn and Steve Powell.

2. Approval of Minutes of Prior Meeting

Minutes of May 4, 2010 were approved.

3. Marty Rosen reported on GPAC

GPAC has identified five focus areas. GPAC has met approximately 14 times; many of their actions and decisions are governed by the fact that seventy percent of the growth plan for our area was approved by the County, prior to Menifee's attainment of Cityhood. Determining the size of industrial parcels, which may range from ½ acre to 24 acres, must include offset areas, which serve as a buffer between the industrial and residential areas.

4. Rob introduced a speaker from Waste Management

Steve Glynn, Community and Public Affairs Manager for Waste Management, provided maps showing current schedule of trash pickup and another map with proposed future changes. The consensus was that the proposed changes are much needed. (*since it seems that this area, like Mopsy in Uncle Tom's cabin, just grewed.*). No action or recommendation was requested.

6. Current Topics of Discussion

Members reported on the public's response to the poll: three issues of most concern in their area, as well as the three top things desired for the city. Traffic congestion remains the most cited problem, with the need for cleanup of bank repos that have been allowed to fall into disrepair, running a close second. Wide varieties of desires were expressed, but mostly; solve the three most important issues of concern. Most of the persons queried were optimistic, and believed that the City is making a sincere effort to address the problems.

7. Discussion and Scheduling of Next Meeting

Because the City Council has not determined the procedure to replace a member of the committee if it becomes necessary, Chairperson Mark Cooper assembled a group consisting of Thomas Giedroyce, Christine Schwartz, Leah McGee and Marty Rosen, to set policies and procedures, which will be presented by MCAC to the City Council for approval.
